




Gluten Free is a Highly Niche Market

- Driven by just 2.5% of U.S. households
 - Even they just buy \$185 in GF products/year
- 1% of parent categories in 2012
 GF flour 2.6% of total flour sales
- 403 companies selling gluten free products
 - But 81% have \$1 million sales or less

Many Americans are considering cutting back on the amount of gluten in their diets or avoiding it altogether. However, nutritionists say that if this is not done carefully, the diet can be unhealthy.

In a recent poll, 30 percent of adults said they wanted to "cut down or be free of gluten," according to The NDP Group, the market-research company that conducted the poll. That's the highest percentage of people to report having this goal since the poll began asking the question in 2009, NDP says.

Food Security: An Incredibly Complex Problem


- Governments need food security = power

"If you desire peace, cultivate justice, but at the same time cultivate the fields to produce more bread; otherwise there will be no peace." – Dr. Norman Borlaug




French Revolution: 1789 to 1799

Good Intentions, But Not Sustainable

- Local Food Production is important, <u>but</u> too much emphasis on self-sufficiency works against real food security:
 - Increased farm subsidies
 - Budgetary costs, graft, waste, protectionism
 - Import restrictions needed to protect artificial local prices are antithetical to food security



Even if production subsidies seem to work in the short term...they are not sustainable.



High Price Supports Lead to Actions Antithetical to Food Security

- Artificial pricing
- Distorted prices
- False investment signals
- Inefficient investments
- Unwanted surpluses
- Storage costs and waste
- Export subsidies
- Import restrictions

False market signals always distort markets and encourage uneconomic investments that waste capital.





G20 – In 2011, Sarkozy Called for:

- International Information System
- Internationally Controlled Emergency Stocks
- New Trading Rules to Fight Volatility

Proved Unworkable

- Stocks expensive
- International coordination cumbersome
- Treating only the symptoms, not the cause of volatility
- Came to nothing but AMIS (Ag Market Information System) under FAO, largely redundant with USDA and IGC information



WTO Failure at Bali: A Step Backward in Trade & Real Food Security!

- India's Food Security
 Demands Delay WTO
 Trade Facilitation Agreement
 - Allows trade distorting subsidies beyond current WTO limits
 - Public stockholding already allowed
 - Threatened TFA benefits
 - Millions of jobs
 - \$520 billion in higher GDP for food insecure countries
 - Not really a food security initiative at all it was about trade distorting domestic support





Foreign Farmland Purchases

- Governments don't make good farmers!
- Cannot truly control the foodstuffs produced in another country
 - Subject to civil unrest, embargoes, logistical disruption, expropriation of production or land

- Open Markets
- Better Market Infrastructure for Local Production and International Trade
- More Anti-Corruption Efforts
- Less Government Interference in Individual Economic Freedom
 and Opportunity
- Less Government Involvement in Market Prices and Trade
- Rule of Law
- Property Rights, Security of Investment
- Adopting New Technologies Like Biotechnology
- Education, Personal Economic Freedom and Security

Focus on these strategies first!


Trade Is Not A New Idea

Invest in Sustainable Technology

- How to produce more with less
- Science-based assessments
- Modern breeding techniques, including biotechnology
 - Reduced total pesticide use
 - Reduced energy use
 - Reduced soil erosion, improved water quality
 - Carbon sequestration
 - Greater production and greater security of production
- Workable registration regimes and tolerance levels for biotech products





Global Prosperity Depends on Trade

"Predictable, open and transparent markets will provide an environment for countries to obtain sustainable food security through private sector investment in efficient, lowest-cost food systems. Without that, **no amount** of government investment, policy declaration, and/or coercion can achieve real food security." – Paul Green, Agricultural Economist

- No export taxes

- Limits to trade distorting domestic subsidies
- Full transparency



Why Wheat ...

- Most important grain; world's top food grain
- 1st in planted area; 2nd (to corn) in tonnage
- 20% of the world's calorie consumption
- 20% of protein for poorest half of the world
- Most traded grain: 150+ MMT traded annually
- Major wheat exporters (U.S., Canada, Australia) could easily comply
- Promises importers guaranteed access to exportable wheat supplies
